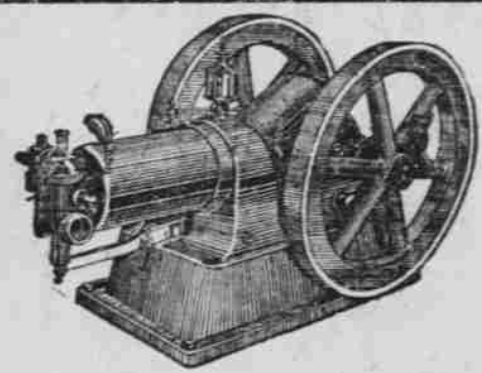

DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION It Will Be Held on April 19, Primaries Two Days Before.

The democratic city convention will be held on April 19 and the primaries on April 17. This was decided by the executive committee of five yesterday. The convention comes five days later than the republican municipal convention.

The leading democrats are not quite sure what will be done by the convention but a majority of them incline to the opinion that there will be no endorsement of any candidate on any other ticket. It was thought by some that the name of J. H. Langston, the citizens' ticket candidate for the council for the third ward, might be put on the democratic ticket, but it has been given out that nothing of the

kind will be done. An effort has been made by some of the democrats to induce Langston to withdraw from the citizens' ticket but without success. If he would do so he would probably be given the democratic nomination. It was the plan of a majority of the leaders to nominate Dunlap for mayor but a canvass of the situation in the third ward discloses no available candidate for the council there and an effort will be made to induce him to take the nomination for that office instead of the nomination for mayor.

The socialists nominated a ticket on Thursday night as follows: For mayor, August Hegelund, councilman for the first ward, S. E. Hayden; councilman of the third ward, M. J. Hanchmore; city marshal, H. E. Gilliland; assessor and tax collector, James Watkins; treasurer, R. B. Dawson; recorder, David King. The members of the city central committee are S. E. Hayden, J. A. Fulwiler, L. A. DeViron, J. D. Martin and J. A. Mallory.

An attempt was made by the citizens' committee to have the socialists fuse on the anti-gambling issue. The leaders of the party, though they said that they were in sympathy with the issue believed that they could not afford to merge with any other party.
