**Indians.**

The Pima Indians were out on the war-path last week and on Friday they killed six Apaches, on the Rio Verde, above McDowell. K. S. Woolsey, from Agua Caliente, reports that Indian signs are becoming plentiful about his place; also, a Mexican who came to him riding a good-for-nothing horse and looking for work. After staying all night, said Mexican stole one of his (Woolsey's) best mares and escaped in broad day light, undiscovered.

During this week Barnett & Block received a new lot of goods from Ehrenberg and shipped, by their own train, 60,000 pounds of barley to some of the northern posts. S. Abrahamson shipped for H. Mannasse, 20,000 pounds of barley to Wickenburg.
