From Clifton to the Gulf by Water,

G. W. Evans arrived in Phoenix having come all the way from Clifton to Sacaton in a boat. These gentlemen enjoy the proud distinction of being the first men to pass through the box canyon of the Gila by water. They left Clifton on January second and laucching their boat which had been specially constructed for a complete a the Sa-Francisco river, they journeyed down that stream to the Gila which they entared fourteen miles below Cliften From that point they remained n the Gila, until they reached Sacaton, travelling by that stream about three hundred miles There they disembarked and hauled their boat to Phoenix and after laying in provisione, etc., will leave tomorrow on the Sal's river, to the Gila, thence to the Colorado and by that stream to the Gulf.
