GLOBE POWER COMPANY THE PRELIMINARY WORK

Chas. M. Clark, of the Globe Power company was in from Salt river this week having a boat built for use in the preliminary work being conducted by Engineer Geo. M. Bull and party. A sudden rise in the river on the night of July 5 carried away the boat that the company had been using.

Mr. Bull, who represents the parties financing the proposition, is an hydraulic engineer of ability who for the past three years has been engaged in hydraulic work along the Hudson river, New York. The work which he is now engaged upon is measuring the flow of water in the river, running lines for a system of reservoirs, surveying for a tunnel to be 7,015 feet in length, and run from the mouth of Cherry creek to Redman flat, and other work of a preliminary character which will require six weeks or two months longer to complete.

The Globe Power company proposes to construct works on upper Salt river and distributing lines to cost \$1,500,000. From careful measurements taken over a series of years, it is estimated that from 7000 to 8000 electric horse power can be developed and the principal field for its employment will be in Globe district, for the development and operation of mines.

The El Paso Times says: Thomas F. Cole, president of the Calumet & Arizona Mining company and of its subsidiary companies, operating in the Warren mining district at Bisbee, vice-president and general manager of the Oliver Iron Mining company of Minnesota, and United States Steel corporation property, and president of the Coalition Copper company, was in El Paso yesterday for a few hours and was registered at the Sheldon.

Mr. Cole is one of the heaviest copper operators in the United States today and is heavily interested in the Globe Consolidated Copper company, of Globe, which has been organized and which is so much sought for by investors.

Mr. Cole is now on his way to Bisbee and Globe, where in the former city he will look over the properties and in the latter will oversee the opening up of the Globe Consolidated. In Bisbee, also, he will perfect plans for the issuance of the stock certificates for the Superior & Arizona Mining company, which is the name of the consolidation which recently took over all the Cole properties with the exception of Calumet & Arizona. This stock is now selling about three hundred per cent on the par value.
