#

About 1 o'clock this morning one of the two houses that stood on the east side of South First street between China alley and Jackson street was destroyed by fire. The house was a one story brick structure with wooden roof and was divided into three spites. One was occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Wood, another by a colored woman and the third by Honest John, a colored man whose other name was not learned, if he has any, but who carned that sobriquet some years ago by catching the largest fish in the Sait river-and proving it, John saved a few personal effects, the fire starting toward the other end of the building. The original was not learned and the building was a total loss. It belonged to a man formerly employed by one of the railroads as a car cleaner. Hundreds of people turned out in response to the fire alarm as the blaze seemed to be in Chinatown and there was a general fear that the noodle joint was doomed.
