STANFORD AND WASHINGTON CREWS READY TO RACE TODAY

Chick Orme, Local Boy, This Is Old Man Captain of Stanford Crew, Writes On Hopes of Vietory; Fast Time Made In Crew Practice

Leased Wire] SEATTLE, Wash., April 6 .- Weather conditions promise to be favorable for the race between the Varsity best rews of Stanford University and the University of Washington, which will begin at 4:30 tomorrow afternoon from Leschi Park, on Lake Washington and finish at Madison Park, three miles north of the starting Thorpe Babcock, former Yale earsman, is in full charge of the 3rtangements.
