ELIAS ADJUDGED INSANE

Experts So Report After Examining the Condemned Murderer.

At a meeting of a board of medical experts in Tucson last Friday afternoon, composed of Dr. W. H. Ward, superintendent of the territorial insane asylum at Phoenix, and Drs. Martin and Foss, both of Phoenix, it was decided, says the Citizen, that Teodoro Elias, convicted of the murder of Police Officer W. H. Katzenstein, on the night of July 26th, 1902, and under sentence of death, is insane, and the following report was handed to Judge Davis:

Tucson, Ariz., August 19, 1904. To the Honorable George B. Davis, Judge of the District Court of Pima County, and Honorable Frank E. Murphy, Sheriff of said county, Tucson, Arizona, Gentlemen:

We hereby certify that at your request we have made a careful examination of Teodoro Elias, now confined in the jail of Pima county, under sentence of death, and find him a sexual neurotic and subject to hallucinations and illusions. We concur in the opinion that the said Teodoro Elias is at the present time an insane person and it is our judgment that his mental condition will grow steadily worse and probably end in dementia.

(Signed) ANCIL MARTIN, M. D., J. W. FOSS, M. D., W. H. WARD, M. D., Superintendent of Territorial Insane Asylum.

When seen by a Citizen reporter this morning, Judge Davis said: "You can quote me as saying that I will recommend to the governor that the sentence of Elias be commuted to life imprisonment in the territorial penitentiary."

It is regarded as probable that Governor Brodie will follow the recommendation of Judge Davis and commute the sentence to life imprisonment, in which case Elias would be sent to the penitentiary.

There is no means of knowing how long it will be before the governor will act. Sheriff Murphy had nothing to say regarding the matter. There is a provision in the statutes which allows an examination in a case of this kind without the participation of a jury.

James T. Lewis, Wisconsin's famous war governor, who died at his home in Columbus, Wis., recently, was an uncle of Mrs. W. H. Dunham, of Globe, Arizona. Death resulted practically from starvation, as the stroke of paralysis which he suffered some months previous, involved his tongue and throat, making it almost impossible

for him to swallow anything. He was governor of Wisconsin during the civil war, and the principle which governed his administration is embodied in a declaration which he made at that time: "He who is not a faithful friend to the government of his country in this trying hour, is no friend of mine." Governor Lewis was born in Clarendon, N. Y., October 19, 1819, and removed to Columbus, Wis., in 1843, and in 1845 was admitted to the bar. It has been stated that Governor Lewis always enjoyed the confidence of his fellow citizens, irrespective of party.
