

The Box Canyon.

In our account of the recent exploration of the Box canon of the Salt river, we stated that the passage through the gorge by Messrs. Robinson, Burch, Logan and Meaders was the first ever It now turns out that we were made premature in this statement. Postmaster Mowry related to the reporter this morning his recollections of the description of the canon and a trip made through the same by Frank Middleton, now of Flagstaff, and his brother in-law George Shute, now residing on the upper Salt river. This was eight or ten years ago. The two men started out to make the descent of the canou on foot, their rifles, blankets carrying tood. There was much less water in the stream than at present, but nevertheless the adventurers had a very severe struggle, and came very nearly perishing before they got through. They lost their guns, and exhausted or lost their provisions when out a few days. Nevertheless they succeeded in making the trip and came on to Phœnix, where they carefully related their experience to Mr. Mowry.
