#### WATER USERS COUNCIL

Institutes a Movement for Priority Agreement Among Land Owners.

There was an all day session yesterday of the council of the water users association, devoted mainly to consideration of plans for an agreement or stipulation for the purpose of facilitating the settlement of the priority suit. The forenoon was devoted to a report of the subcommittee which held a meeting previously for a simila purpose to listen to plans prepared and simplify action. The sub committee reported two proposed plans, one presented by Frank Parker and the other by C. B. Wood.

The afternoon was devoted to a discussion of these plans after which resolutions were passed authorizing further action and which are given below The Parker plan which had been submitted at the meeting of the sul committee was further elucidated so that when considered yesterday it coered four large typewritten pages. 1 cannot be reproduced at this time ex cept by brief reference as follows: is based on the general admission tha there are 750 quarter sections or 120. 000 acres in the valley that are firs entitled to water up to the measure their needs, before other lands, As suming that the plan is signed by al the owners of these lands the pla stipulates that pending the adjudica tion of the Hurley-Abbot suit the own ers of these 750 quarter sections agree among themselves that the water sup ply whatever it be shall be prorated i their lands at any stage of the river up to the full measure of the apropria tions belonging to these lands. The for the purpose of carrying out th stipulation the records of the Wormse case against the north side canals an the data collated by the water storage commission, shall be the basis fo the determination of the location of the said 750 quarter sections. It suggest that matters would be facilitated this area entitled to first flow could b reduced to 700 quarter sections to b designated as class A lands and that class B lands could include all othe lands in the valley that have had occusional irrigations and that the owners of such lands could enter into similar agreement. This would include 400 or more quarter sections which would be entitled to water after class A had been served. Then follow excerpts from the "Kibbey table" showing watered acreage, location, etc., and suggestions concerning details of the plan, which of course should be read in full and understood before either adopted or condemned by the reader of this article.

The plan of C. B. Wood was similar but more brief as to detail and like the other can only be referred to here. It suggests first that the Tempe and San Francisco continue to get water as at present under the Kibbey decision. That it be understood by all other land owners htat forty inches is a maximum need for a quarter section and that the lands be divided into four classes, A, B, C, and D, according to priority of filings. That the owners of all classes agree to a stipulation on these lines and share equitably the cost of settling the priority litigation.

#### MACHINERY CONTRACTS

#### Purchase of Equipment for Roosevelt Dam Construction.

Messrs O'Rourke and Steinmetz, ontractors for the construction of the Roosevelt dam yesterday placed a couple of orders for machinery, with the representatives of eastern houses who were mentioned in yesterday's paper. The orders will approximate something over \$40,000, including freight and installation at the dam

One order was for two large cable ways and was placed with the Lidgerwood Manufacturing Co., of New York, represented by Frank B. Knight. The other order was for a half dozen large derricks, especially constructed to meet the requirements of the work. This order was given to the American Hoist and Derrick Co., of St. Paul, represented by Frank J. Johnson and will approximate \$18,000.

These figures of course are somewhat larger than the net cost of the machinery and are approximated for it is impossible to tell just what the freight will be. It will be nearly as much from Mesa City, by wagon as the freight to that point from the place of manufacture.


