

Granite Reef-On account of the men leaving for the holiday vacation the camp at the present time prevents a rather deserted appearance. However, as soon as the material which will be used in the substantial permanent part of the dam arrives that work will go on rapidly, A blacksmith shop has been installed at the quarry and two smiths are kept busy dressing the tools used in mining the huge granite boulders which will be hauled later on by tramway to the dam. The rock crusher has been set up and is ready for work as soon as the material is delivered to ft. A small row boat has been built which carries the men across the river that are negaged in setting the cement posts for the cable tower. Jack Whitney with his force of seventy-five men arrived at the camp Sunday evening from the diversion dam above Livingstone which they have just completed. The force was to have been here two weeks ago but was delayed on account o fthe recent rise in the river. It is expected that the Whitney force will work on the north side of the river using the south side camp.
