

There are many infielders who cover a lot of ground and hit well, such as Baker and Menlnis, of the Athletics; white Sox; Chase, of the Yankees; Konetchy, of the Cardinals and Larry Doyle, of the Giants, but none of these as a batting average hovering around 350 year in and year out, and at the same time possess the fielding ability of Collins, Wagner and Lejole.

The big league teams ar generally onstructed on the basis of a strong defensive infield and a strong offensive unfield, but there must be good fielding nd hitting ability all around. Most hampionship teams have two or more xecquional hitters in the outfield, such as Clarge and Leach, of the Pirates; Hofman, Schulte and Sheckard, of the Cubs, and Cobb and Crawford, of the Tigers. The Athletics are an exception, as their principal hitting strength centres in the infield around Collins and Baker.
