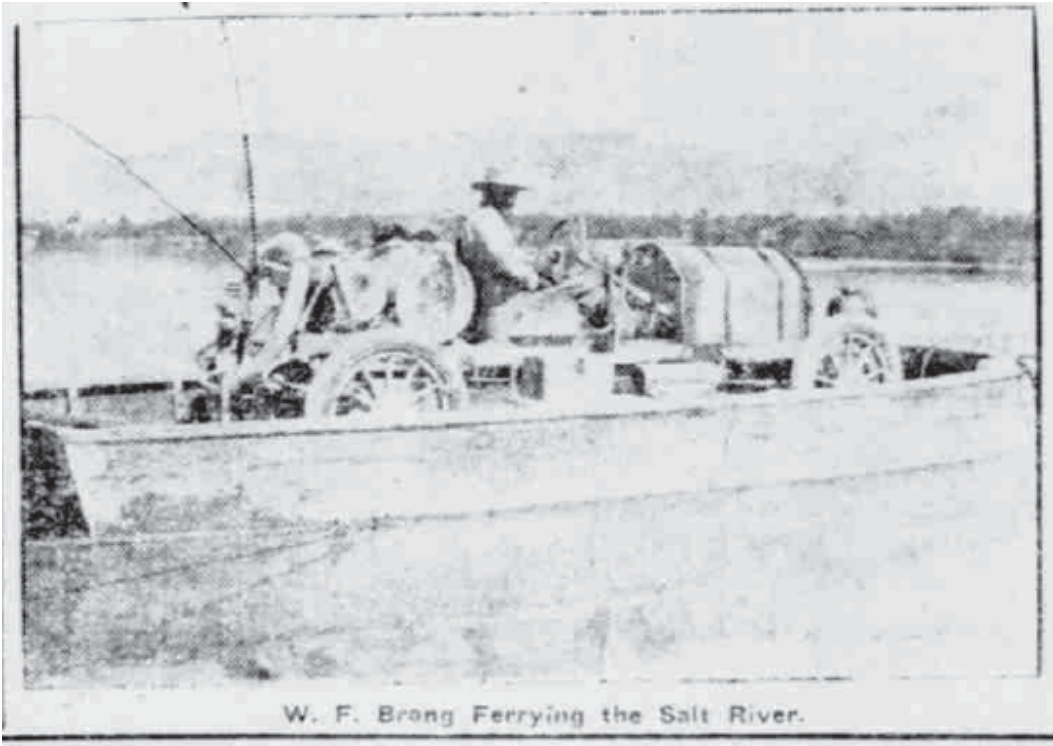

SPORT NEWS FROM FAR AND NEAR

TRY TO SWIPE COBB'S CROWN

Philadelphia Fans Much Interested in Doping Collins as Greater Player Than Navin's Georgia Peach

On the basis that a star infielder who is a hard hitter is more valuable to his team than a hard hitting outfielder, Philadelphia "fans" are trying to pry loose the crown of baseball from Ty Cobb's brow and place it on the receptive head of Eddie Collins.

Combining defensive and offensive ability to the highest degree, it is maintained that players like Wagner, Collins and Lejole do more to hold their teams up in the race than the Cobbs, Schutes and Jacksons. This is a difficult question to decide. Clever fielding and good hitting are used in outfielders more often than not, but in among the infielders it is rare that a brilliant and spectacular fielder is mighty with the stick.

AUTO TO RACE BIPLANE IN COMBINATION MEET

One of the big features of the Land and Air Meet which opens at the fair ground next Thursday for a three day run, will be a race between W. F. Brong in an automobile and Frank Bryant in a Curtiss biplane.

There are many infielders who cover a lot of ground and hit well, such as Baker and Menhinis, of the Athletics; Hobitzel, of the Reds; Lord, of the white Sox; Chase, of the Yankees; Kometchy, of the Cardinals and Larry Doyle, of the Giants, but none of these have a batting average hovering around .350 year in and year out, and at the same time possess the fielding ability of Collins, Wagner and Lejole.

The big league teams are generally constructed on the basis of a strong defensive infield and a strong offensive outfield, but there must be good fielding and hitting ability all around. Most championship teams have two or more exceptional hitters in the outfield, such as Clarke and Leach, of the Pirates; Hofman, Schutte and Sheekard, of the Cubs, and Cobb and Crawford, of the Tigers. The Athletics are an exception, as their principal hitting strength centres in the infield around Collins and Baker.

If the infielders have hitting strength so much the better for a team. But it doesn't prove anything for Collins, and he will have to keep up his good work for several seasons in order to convince most "fans" that he is as great a player as the only Ty Cobb.

Mr. Lacy and his wife have spent the last three winters in this city. Their home is in New York state. This time they will give the railroads the merry boot and transport themselves back home.

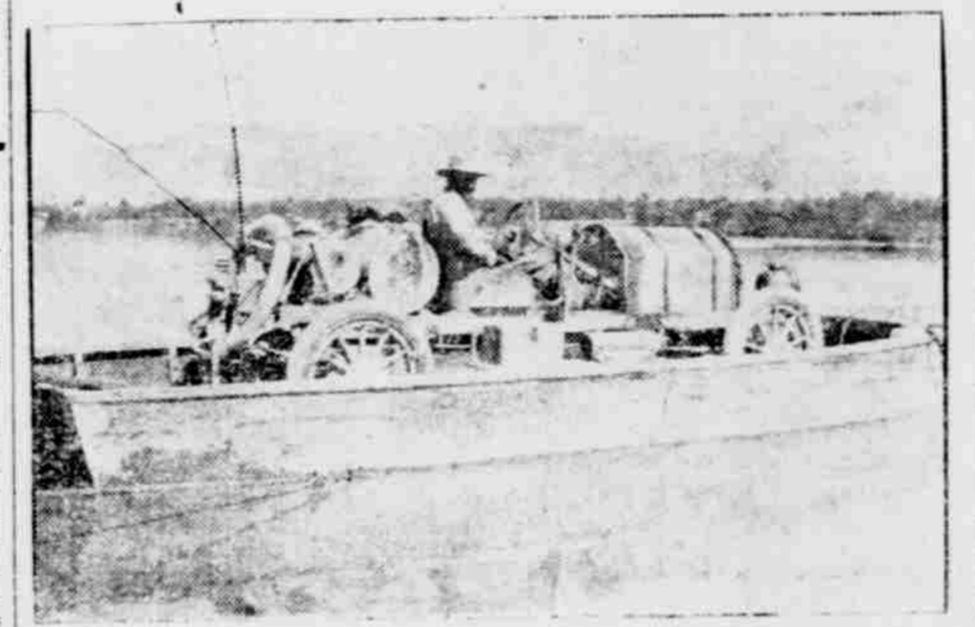
Their route will include the grand canyon, petrified forest, Albuquerque, Denver, Omaha, Chicago and Buffalo.

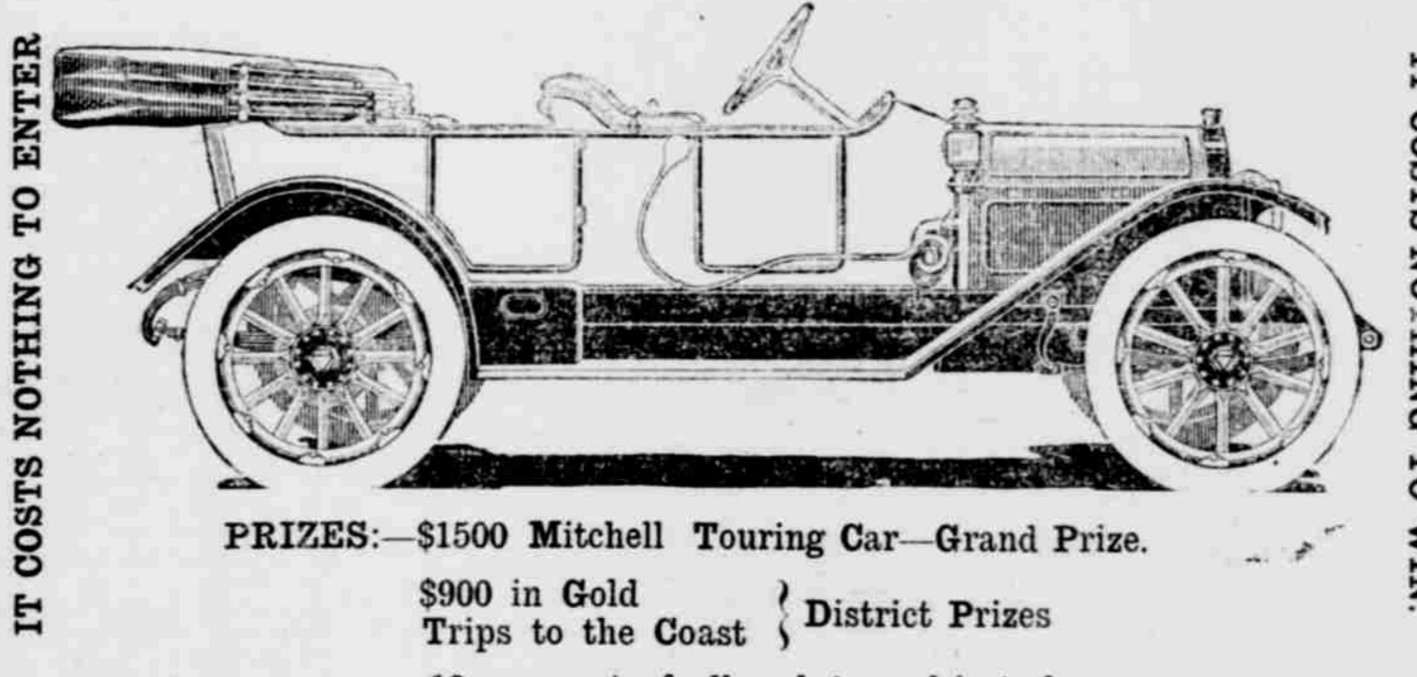
