overtaken the river's population.

When the report became current around town that all the fish in the river were dead or dying, there was considerable excitement among the colored citizens who are noted as fishermen, and _ ank Shirley sent a committee to the river to ascertain if the catfish were included in the disaster. His advices last evening were that few if any catfish had died.


