The western states are particularly well represented and are expected to make a good showing in many of the racing events. Among the scheduled events of interest to western men are the division salking races, war canoe race for the American Canoe association championship and division paddling races. The western division holds a paddling event this year for the first time, racing for the Gardiner cup. The northwest division will have a war cance race for valuable trophies. If present indications are fulfilled the war canoe race for the American Canoe association championship will be the biggest in the way of a paddling contest ever held in America, Among the clubs that have entered crows for all of the events are the Buffalo Canoa club, Knickerbocker (N. Y.) Canca club, Webewawa Canoe club, Auburndale, Mass.; Toronto Canon association, and the Conce club, of Brockville, Cance. Other clubs that will contest in one or more of the events are from Mourreal, Kingston, Milwaukee, luth and Orrawa.
