- 2 So I'm asking you. You say things like
- 3 because it shows there's a road or because they
- 4 describe crossing the river on foot, that that means
- 5 it's nonnavigable. So, clearly, you must have decided
- 6 that there's some threshold for navigability there,
- 7 because the person we have in your report doesn't say
- 8 that.
- 9 So if you could cross a river on foot, does
- 10 that make it nonnavigable?
- 11 A. I've tried to be very careful in my
- 12 presentation and, also, in the report, to indicate any
- 13 descriptions of the river in terms of navigability were
- 14 the descriptions that were being offered by the
- 15 particular individual and not my interpretation of
- 16 them.
- For example, with the surveyors I indicated
- 18 that whether they meandered the river or not, I
- 19 indicated that by the meanders or nonmeanders, that
- 20 this was consistent with the instructions of the
- 21 surveyor to either meander a navigable body of water or
- 22 not meander it. I try not to let my own
- 23 interpretations enter into this.
- Q. Well, we'll get to the surveyors in probably
- 25 horrific detail a little bit later here.
